Dear Jack,

I was very pleased to see from your letter of April 11th that your Company will support our suggestion for exchange of information on "Stroke" work. I agree with you that we do not want to get into the position of having to produce voluminous reports for each other and nothing is further from my thoughts. I sincerely hope that this collaboration will not lead to the writing of one single extra report. All that I have in mind is that Anderson shall send Lavorte our "Stroke Ex grams" and also copies of any reports on stroke which from time to time are written. This far it is just routine, but what I do feel will be the great advantage is that Anderson, Sir Charles Ellis and Lavorte will feel free to write to each other about ideas, tentative results and scientific theories. If, for example, we are doing something that is of particular interest to your Company I suggest Lavorte should let Anderson know in the hope that information, by correspondence, on the way the experiments are coming out might save your Company from having to carry out the same experiments. If such friendly collaboration were to develop in time to the point where we deliberately shared in a programme of work, we, certainly, should welcome it, but that may either come or not come and is not something to plan.
