Dear Norman,

For your information I am sending you herewith a copy of a report prepared for the benefit of the Canadian Tobacco Manufacturers' Council, that outlines the experimental program to be conducted on our farm on behalf of the Canadian industry. There are also references to certain aspects of work to be done by the CDA Station.

Much of the program has to do with PRT 71, but there are other elements having to do with the growing of standard flue cured tobacco. We have presented results of analyses of the 1971 and 1972 PRT tobaccos to the CDA Station in the presence of R & D personnel from other companies, but this is the first written account of progress to be submitted to the C.T.M.C. As you can tell, the emphasis is on leaf rather than PRT, and I hope nothing has been said that ought not to have been said.

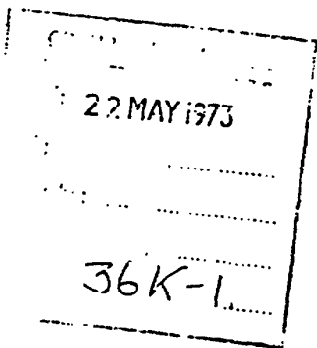
The budget was approved by Mr. Paré on behalf of the Council some time ago, but only leaf and R & D people from other companies are as yet familiar with the program.
