Dear Bob,

I enclose a copy of Richard Binns' report on his visit to Montreal, which I am sure you will find of interest. This has not been edited in any way and I should point out it might have been slightly different if intended primarily for your eyes!

It occurs to me that it might be opportune at this time for you to review the objectives of the biological (or rather biochemical) programme in Montreal. Around the Group work of this nature was initiated with pretty loose objectives - rather in the nature of getting our feet wet or feeling the temperature first. If, when you have considered this, you might wish to dovetail the Montreal work in this area into programmes elsewhere, I would be more than happy, if you consider it would be helpful, for Richard Binns or someone else from here, to visit you to explore and plot closer co-operation. Perhaps we can talk about this when you come over, if you wish to pursue the idea further. For our part, we believe there are two very strong groups operating in Montreal universities and there would appear to be considerable merit in following up your contacts there.
