Report RD. 555-R is enclosed. This examination was undertaken because of some S.C.L. temperature measurements and also because there was a suggestion that the chloride content of tobacco is connected with combustion temperature.

In general, the results show again that cigarettes with low smoulder temperatures give low yields of benzpyrene but chloride content of tobacco does tend to increase the delivery of benzpyrene. Obviously, this is worth pursuing further.

A very interest fact also emerged - that the smoke from BASTOS BLEU has a low yield of benzpyrene.
