Here is our Report No. RD.936-R. We are examining currently a number of commercial brands of cigarettes which contain large amounts of indigenous tobacco. The aim is to increase our knowledge of the effects of different types of tobacco on the composition and biological activity of smoke.

One of these brands is the cigarette 'Gallia', about which there has been considerable press comment along the lines of a "safer" cigarette. According to Campbell-Southern, Ltd., Gallia will be on sale throughout France from 15th September onwards.

In view of the interest in this cigarette, we have produced a report specifically on Gallia. I suggest that the biological tests are not quoted in any way without prior consultation with R. & D.
