Thank you for your letter of 28th November and for your agreement to circulate Huber's paper, which I will now do.

Thank you, too, for the detailed account of the proceedings of the CRC in relation to the Passey-Elson experiment. I think you were right to cut your losses on this work at Industrial Bio-Test. While Nettel is undoubtedly a leading worker, he is a member of the "international grapevine" embracing Dentonwill, Gori, Wynder and others and ORNL is a quasi-official laboratory, so that the CRC might find it difficult to control publication. MacFarland is a different proposition, however, as a strictly contract research worker.

As you may know, we invited MacFarland here last week, en route to his Stockholm engagement. I enclose a note on the discussion which will interest Bob Gibb, I think. I did not mention anything about CRC at all as I wasn't sure you would get my letter before your meeting and I couldn't even guess whether CRC would welcome an approach to Bio-Research Labs.
