Dear Leo,

Thank you for your various letters dated 25th February and for sending a copy of Jim Hogg's letter of 20th January. I take it that you have, by now, received our comments on his research proposal.

I am enclosing with this letter my reply to Jim Hogg and would be grateful if you would ensure he received it. You will see that I have alluded in a general way to his application to the CTMC. I am sure there would be no difficulties in offering advice or information from this end, in the event that the proposal developed into some kind of joint study.
