JAMES - VINCENY STYLE


Thank you very much for your letter of November 4th with the copy of the memorandum from Mr. Sand outlining the shipping schedule proposed for the VINCENY JAMES sample. I agree with Billy that this schedule should be satisfactory and, unless we have any unexpected difficulties with the Customs authorities at Southampton, we should be able to make the first main shipment to Frankfurt in good time for the start at the beginning of January. It is reassuring to know that, if we do run into any unexpected difficulties, you will be retaining a quarter of a million cigarettes and would be able to air-freight some of these direct to Frankfurt should the need arise.

I was glad to learn that the tobaccos for the W samples arrived safely.

I gather from Billy that the conference went off well and that, as usual, you are looking after him at Louisville.
