I would like to thank you for your kind letter of April 27th.,
in which you confirm arrangements made with Dr. S.J.Green in London.


I also wish to thank you and your staff for the thoughtful
and courteous reception accorded me last Monday. The visit to the making
floor was especially helpful in assisting my visualisation of your own
problems. While I remain impressed with the possibilities of this concept
developed by Messrs Bell and Laing, one must be prepared to find that it
has been anticipated in the prior art. My visit to B-A.T. in London should
be most informative in this respect.

In talking to Mr.Bell this morning he wished me to emphasise
that, merely putting a hole down the centre of a normally packed cigarette
would lead to a slightly hotter cigarette. The degree of packing must be
such that the resistance to gas flow of the unperforated tobacco is at least
5 x that of the conventional packing. Should any of your staff wish to
question him further regarding either the making or the manner in which he
tested his cigarettes, perhaps they might care to contact him at U.of T.
