Fair PharmaCare deductibles for 2007

Fair PharmaCare assistance levels for 2007 are based on family net income for 2005.

On January 1, 2007, PharmaNet will be updated to reflect deductibles and family maximums for 2007 for all individuals and families registered in the Fair PharmaCare plan. Deductible accumulations will be set to zero.

Deductible information for patients for 2007

Fair PharmaCare registrants can access information about their deductible, the portion of eligible costs that Fair PharmaCare pays after the deductible is met, and their family maximum in the following ways.

Through the PharmaCare website at www.health.gov.bc.ca/pharme, registrants can:

- use the Fair PharmaCare Calculator to estimate this information, or
- request that a Confirmation of Fair PharmaCare Assistance be mailed to them.

Registrants can also contact Health Insurance BC (see contact information on the following page). Callers will need to provide appropriate identifying information.

For your convenience and to assist you in helping patients who may ask about their Fair PharmaCare coverage, we are including at the end of this newsletter [a flyer](#) you may wish to post in your pharmacy.

Retroactive reimbursements for 2006

Individuals or families who exceeded the Fair PharmaCare deductible between January 1, 2006, (or the date on which their Medical Services Plan coverage became effective, whichever is later) and the date their Fair PharmaCare registration for 2006 was processed, will be reimbursed for any eligible prescription costs they paid during that time.

Families do not have to apply for this retroactive reimbursement; it will be calculated automatically after the end of the calendar year.

In the spring of 2007, PharmaCare will send a letter to each individual or family who qualifies for reimbursement. The letter will specify the amount of their reimbursement and advise them that a cheque has been issued.

Monthly Deductible Payment Option (MDPO) reminder

PharmaCare is accepting enrolments in the Monthly Deductible Payment Option for 2007. Letters have been sent to those who enrolled for 2006 advising them that enrolment for 2007 is not automatic. If they wish to re-enrol, they must respond as directed in the letter.

The option is designed to assist individuals or families who:

- are registered for Fair PharmaCare,
 - do not have private health insurance with a drug benefit plan,
 - have a deductible greater than \$0, and
 - expect their annual prescription costs to meet or exceed their Fair PharmaCare deductible.

Families who enrol in the MDPO will pay their 2007 Fair PharmaCare deductible in monthly instalments and will begin to receive assistance with their eligible prescription costs right away.

Update—Payments for Services to Residents of Long-Term Care Facilities

In April 2006, the following interim solution (April 1 to September 30, 2006) for Plan B payments was implemented:

- Payment for services to permanent residents of licensed long-term care facilities was changed to \$35 per **occupied** bed, per month (rather than per patient).
- Pharmacies submitted claims for monthly capitation fees using the same PharmaCare invoice form and procedures that were in place before December 31, 2005.
- For May, June and July, pharmacies claiming Plan B payments were asked to provide PharmaCare with reports of the Personal Health Numbers (PHNs) of the residents in the long-term care facilities they serve.

Until further notice, the rate of \$35 for occupied bed, per month, remains in effect.

We would like to thank pharmacies for their cooperation in providing accurate information.

Pharmacies do not need to submit any further PHN reports. **However, pharmacies must continue submitting invoices promptly after the close of each month to receive payment.** Invoices should be mailed to:

PharmaCare recently completed a review of these files. Revised, updated versions are now available on our website at www.health.gov.bc.ca/pharme/outgoing/index.html.

The layout of some of the updated files has changed. Please consult the table layout pages for current information on file layout and for clarified data descriptions.

The drug data files will be updated at the beginning of each month and uploaded to the website approximately one week later.

IMPORTANT:

- Only drugs transmitted on PharmaNet and adjudicated by PharmaCare are listed in the files.
- The Manufacturer Prices file is no longer being updated. It will be removed from the website on January 17, 2007. Please note that the data this file currently contains is actually PharmaCare maximum price data.

Veterinary Prescriptions—Reminder

When dispensing veterinary medications, please do not assign a PHN to an animal. Instead, **use the PHN of the pet's owner.**

To prevent the drug from adjudicating on PharmaNet and to ensure the drug will not appear on the pet owner's patient record:

- Use the **veterinarian's license number** as the Practitioner Identification (Pract. ID)
- Use **V9** as the Reference Code

Following the requirements above also ensures that the veterinary prescription will not affect Drug Utilization Evaluation (DUE) results for the pet owner.
