IMPLEMENTATION OF METHADONE PRESCRIBING STATUS ON PHARMANET

As described in [PharmaCare Newsletter 07-001](#), methadone prescribing is restricted to physicians holding a specific exemption under Section 56 of the *Controlled Drugs and Substances Act*. Physicians require a separate and distinct exemption to prescribe for each indication—pain control, opioid dependency, or both. The College of Physicians and Surgeons of British Columbia (CPSBC) administrates authorization for physicians to prescribe methadone for pain and/or opioid dependency in keeping with the Act.

Effective **April 23, 2007**, PharmaNet will apply physician prescribing status information to methadone claims submitted on PharmaNet.

It is important to correctly identify the product as prescribed for pain or dependency—by using the appropriate DIN or PIN—as it is the combination of this information with the prescriber's College ID that allows a claim to adjudicate.

If the physician is not authorized to prescribe methadone for the purpose indicated on the prescription ("pain" or "maintenance"), PharmaNet will:

- reject the prescription
- send the message **174 – Transaction not processed, prescriber not authorized to the pharmacy.**

As the rejected prescription cannot be dispensed, the claim will not be adjudicated and will not be recorded on a patient's PharmaNet record.

If a methadone prescription is rejected, please check that you have entered the correct:

- Physician College ID (not the MSP Billing #)
- Methadone DIN or PIN

A list of methadone PINs is provided in Section 6.3 of the PharmaCare/PharmaNet: Policies and Procedures available online at www.health.gov.bc.ca/pharme/generalinfo/policy/.

In rare instances, the most recent daily data load from the CPSBC may not have included a newly authorized prescriber's information. To confirm a prescriber's status, you may wish to contact staff at the CPSBC Drug Programs at 604-733-7758 or 1-800-461-3008.

Please note that the PharmaNet HelpDesk cannot change a physician's methadone status on PharmaNet. This change can be made only by the CPSBC.
