

Product Identification Numbers (PINs) for Publicly-Funded Vaccines

When to use a PIN or a Drug Identification Number (DIN)

- Use a PIN when administering publicly-funded vaccine.
- Use the DIN when administering vaccine to patients not eligible for vaccine from the public supply and charge the patient directly.

Submitting Claims for Publicly-Funded Vaccines

- Claims can be made only for publicly-funded vaccines administered by an authorized pharmacist. Vaccinations provided by other health care professionals, such as nurses hired for pharmacy clinics, cannot be claimed.
- Submit claims using the Product Identification Numbers below. Do not enter a drug cost or fee (and do not use an intervention code).
- Record the lot number for the vaccine provided to each patient in your pharmacy records. Recording vaccine lot numbers is required in case of rare events such as a vaccine recall or an Adverse Event Following Immunization (AEFI).

IMPORTANT NOTES:

- Inclusion of a product in the list of publicly-funded vaccines below does not guarantee a supply of the product is available.
